## 1. Confirmation of Minutes

Minutes of the meeting No. 392 held on 27 March 2024 were approved and signed by the Deputy Chair.

## 2. BELCO Operating Licence OL-114 Application for Reissue

The Authority **TOOK NOTE**:

that the draft OL-114 conditions had been circulated to BELCO for comment before the operating licence was issued. Should BELCO request changes, these will be brought back to the Environmental Authority for consideration.

#### 3. BELCO Complaints—March

It was reported that the March report showed that 4 soot complaints were received for events occurring on 11<sup>th</sup>, 13<sup>th</sup>, 15<sup>th</sup> and 17<sup>th</sup> March. There was one odour/fume complaint on 10<sup>th</sup> March 2024.

# 4. Tynes Bay Waste Facility March Update

4.1 Due to time constraints, this matter was deferred.

# 5. Mediwaste Ltd - Clinical Waste Facility Update

Mr. Starling recused himself from this matter.

The Authority **TOOK NOTE** that:

- 5.1 A meeting was held on 8<sup>th</sup> March 2024 between Ministry of Public Works, Dept of Environment and Natural Resources, and Mediwaste Ltd.
- 5.2 The volume of waste generated at Mediwaste so far suggests that two to four years' worth of ash could be stored in one 20 ft shipping container.
- 5.3 Sites at the Airport Waste Management Facility were viewed where such filled shipping containers could be stored prior to being completely filled with Tynes Bay ash-concrete slurry.
- 5.4 Mediwaste were recommended to collect and store the bagged ash in a 20-foot container located at their site.

5.5 Mediwaste were advised to store all unprocessed waste either in a 20-foot container or inside their building.

# 6. CP-814, OL-1257 Ministry of Public Works Asphalt and Screening Plant

The Authority was reminded that at the last meeting, it granted approval for a construction permit and operating licence for an asphalt plant at the Government Quarry, Hamilton Parish, with the conditions being deferred pending amendment.

# The Authority **APPROVED**:

the proposed changes to the asphalt plant construction permit and operating licence and agreed that they would become standard conditions for all asphalt plants.

# 7. Presentation by Ministry of Public Works on Airport Waste Management Facility 2018-2023 (OL-168)

The Solid Waste Section, Ministry of Public Works, representatives gave a presentation on the operation of the Airport Waste Management Facility (AWMF) for Fiscal Years 2018/2019 to 2022/2023.

### 7.1 Materials Accepted for Disposal:

The AWMF accepts large electrical appliances (eg refrigerators, freezers, CRT TVs, etc), E-Waste for which there is not currently a market in the USA; vehicles, fibreglass, metal wastes, tyres, construction & demolition wastes and TBWEF incinerator ash. It was noted that the weigh scale at the AWMF is still not operational but is expected to be so later this year.

The ash is processed into ash block, ash pancakes or direct buried as unconsolidated ash, depending on availability of trucks and cement or the need for ash pancakes for surface stability or ash blocks for the construction of new cells for infill.

### 7.2 Challenges at the Plant

#### 7.2.1 Fires:

The fire on 19 December 2023 (cause unknown) burned for 8-days. The Ministry of Public Works is still waiting for the Bermuda Fire & Rescue Service's final report. Being subterranean in nature, it was difficult to extinguish.

# 7.2.2 Vehicle and Lithium Batteries:

With there being no worldwide policy for recycling or disposal, lithium batteries from vehicles these are currently being stockpiled in a containment area. Risk of fire is high, so storing and exporting them is problematic.

## 7.2.3 Backlog of Mediwaste Containers of Clinical Waste

Twenty-one (21) containers filled with clinical waste have been stored at the AWMF for about 18 months pending incineration by Mediwaste. These wastes accumulated after the KEMH steam sterilizers were decommissioned and before the Mediwaste facility was operational. This backlog of containers is slowly being treated, with the contents of 3 having been incinerated to date.

#### 7.3 Future of the AWMF Site

7.3.1 In 2024/25, a feasibility study will be undertaken to review materials accepted at the site and review current operations, including improving inspections and sorting of incoming wastes.

- 7.3.2 Working with Keep Bermuda Beautiful (KBB), there will be a cleanup of the beaches in Castle Harbour near the AWMF.
- 7.3.3 There was discussion on the creation of the next cell expected to be constructed in mid-May. The water depth of the new cell is expected to be 45-ft and will require pylons to be driven, fencing to contain floating dunnage and a large number of concrete ash block and heavy metal objects to 'construct' the perimeter. It is expected to accommodate about 18 months' worth of waste.

The Solid Waste Representatives were thanked for their presentation on the Airport Waste Management Facility operations.

## The Authority AGREED:

to consider the operating licence reissue application and conditions at their next meeting.

## 8. Proposal for Legacy Asbestos and Clinical Waste Ash Disposal at AWMF

The Members were reminded that there are approximately 750 twenty-foot shipping containers filled with asbestos that have been in storage at the Government Quarry, Baileys Bay and at BLDC St. Davids for several decades awaiting disposal.

Since 2017, 500 containers worth of asbestos have been shipped abroad for disposal in an appropriate landfill where any subsequent liability does not fall back on Bermuda. The current annual budget of \$300,000 provides for 50 containers per year to be shipped. It is estimated to take a further 11 years and \$4.2 million to dispose of the remaining asbestos overseas. However, many of the containers have degraded to the point where they are not structurally sound and some have been infilled with concrete in preparation for deep sea disposal that was not carried out. These would be very expensive to repackage, if it is even possible to reduce the occupational risk sufficiently for such an activity to occur. It was noted that occupational, public health and environmental risks may increase with time while the containers are stored in the environment.

A proposal was presented to bury the remaining containers of asbestos, together with any containers of Mediwaste ash (See Minutes 28 Feb. 2024), at a defined, purposely constructed site at the Airport Waste Management Facility. Several options for cell construction were presented as were steps to ensure safe transfer of asbestos and clinical waste ash to the site.

## The Authority gave **APPROVAL IN PRINCIPLE**:

for the burial of asbestos containers and medical waste incinerator ash at the AWMF subject to an independent review of the proposed landfill construction and the receipt of the necessary permits/approvals from other Authorities (eg, Dept of Health, Bermuda Airport Authority, etc.).

the construction permit and operating licence applications for a 130 kW diesel generator at 44 Devon Spring Road, Devonshire, subject to standard conditions.

the construction permit and operating licence applications for a 23 kW diesel generator at 2 Glebe Road, St. George's, subject to standard conditions.

the construction permit and operating licence applications for one 23 kW propane generator at 146 Somerset Road, Sandys, subject to standard conditions.

the construction permit and operating licence applications for a 60 kW diesel generator at 9 Addendum Lane, Pembroke, subject to standard conditions.

# 9.9 CP-663, OL-1256 Market Place

the construction permit and operating licence applications for a 225 kW diesel generator at 22 Middle Road, Warwick, subject to standard conditions.
