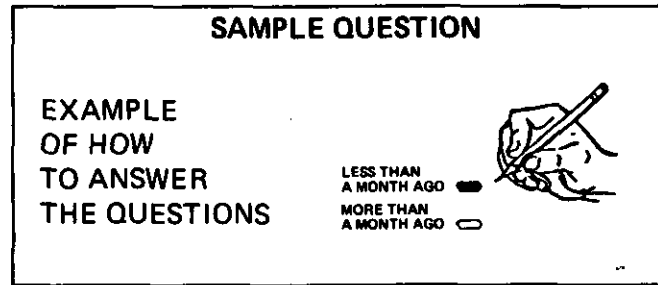

APPENDIX II

THE CENSUS ACT, 1950

BERMUDA 1950: No. 19

TITLE 28

Item 6

Revd. 1971

(Date of Assent 4th April, 1950)

(Operative Date 4th April, 1950)

Whereas it is expedient to provide for the taking of a census in these Islands from time to time as circumstances may require:

Be it, therefore, enacted by the Governor, Legislative Council and Assembly of the Bermudas or Somers Islands as follows:

1. In this Act-

"census order" has the meaning assigned to it in section 3; "the census", in relation to a census order, means the census to which the census order relates;

"census employee" has the meaning assigned to it in section 4; "census officer" has the meaning assigned to it in section 5; "compilation", in relation to a census, means the making of a report or reports on the census including the arrangement and tabulation of particulars and statistics relating to the census, the making of abstracts from the census and similar work relating to the census, as may be required by virtue of the provisions of section 11;

"the Member" means the Member of Executive Council for the time being responsible for registration matters and related matters; "premises" includes any house or part of a house, any land and any vessel; and "prescribed" means prescribed by regulations made under this Act.

2. In the exercise of his functions under this Act the Governor shall act on the advice of the Member.

3. (1) The Governor may by order published in the Gazette direct that a census be taken in these Islands, or in any such part thereof as may be specified in the order, at such time or times as may be specified in the order.

- (2) Any such order as aforesaid is hereafter in this Act referred to as a "census order".
- (3) A census order-
- (a) shall be published at least two months before the time or times at which the census is to be taken;
 - (b) may by order published in the Gazette be revoked by the Governor but without prejudice to the publication of another census order;
 - (c) may by order published in the Gazette be varied by the Governor, so, however, that a census order shall not be varied so that the time or times at which the census is to be taken is earlier than two months after the date of the publication of the census order.
4. (1) On the publication of a census order there shall be appointed a public officer to be Superintendent of Census who shall have the general control and management of the taking and compilation of the census.
- (2) There may be appointed such number of other public officers (hereinafter in this Act referred to as "census employees") to assist the Superintendent of Census in the taking and compilation of the census, as may from time to time be authorised by the Legislature.
5. In this Act, and in any regulations made thereunder, the expression "census officer", in relation to any census the taking of which has been ordered in pursuance of the provisions of this Act, means-
- (a) the Superintendent of Census; and
 - (b) any public officer duly appointed to be a census employee.
6. (1) Where a census order has been published, the Member, subject to the provisions of this section, may make regulations-
- (a) prescribing the particulars as to which information is to be obtained in connection with the taking of the census;
 - (b) prescribing the persons from whom information is to be obtained in connection with the taking of the census;
 - (c) prescribing the method in which information is to be obtained in connection with the taking of the census;
 - (d) prescribing forms of schedules to be filled in with information which is to be obtained in connection with the taking of the census, and other forms to be used for the purposes of the census;
 - (e) prescribing the duties of persons in relation to the giving of information for the purposes of the census;
 - (f) prescribing the powers of census officers;
 - (g) prescribing declarations to be made by census employees in relation to the performance of their duties;
 - (h) generally, for ensuring that the taking and compilation of the census is conducted and completed in an effectual, accurate and expeditious manner;

and such regulations may provide for obtaining different particulars, and for the use of different methods of obtaining information, in respect of different persons or classes of persons or in respect of different places of abode or in respect of different circumstances.

- (2) No regulations shall be made under the provisions of this section unless a draft of the regulations has been laid before both Houses of the Legislature and a resolution approving the draft has been passed by each House of the Legislature and communicated to the Governor by message.
 - (3) Regulations made under the provisions of this section may be varied, amended or revoked by subsequent regulations made in like manner and subject to the like conditions as the original regulations.
 - (4) Regulations made under the provisions of this section shall be published in the Gazette and shall come into operation on the date of such publication or on such later date as may be provided in the regulations.
7. Where a census order has been published, the occupier or person in charge of any premises-
- (a) shall allow any census officer such access to the premises as is reasonably necessary for the discharge of his duties in connection with the taking of the census; and
 - (b) shall allow any census officer to mark or affix on the premises such letters, marks or numbers as the Superintendent of Census may deem necessary for the purposes of the census.
8. Any person who, in connection with any census the taking of which has been ordered in pursuance of the provisions of this Act-
- (a) refuses to give information as prescribed; or
 - (b) gives information which he knows to be false or does not believe to be true; or
 - (c) refuses, in contravention of the provisions of section 7 -
 - (i) to allow any census officer to have access to premises; or
 - (ii) to allow any census officer to mark or affix on premises, any letters, marks or numbers; or
 - (d) wilfully restricts, obstructs or hampers any census officer acting in the discharge of his duties as such; or
 - (e) removes, obliterates, injures or alters any letter, mark or number which has been lawfully marked or affixed on any premises or place for the purposes of the census; or
 - (f) refuses or neglects to comply with the provisions of any regulation made under this Act,
- shall be guilty of an offence against this Act, and shall for each such offence be liable on conviction before a court of summary jurisdiction to a fine not exceeding one hundred and twenty dollars.
9. Any census employee who, in connection with any census ordered to be taken in pursuance of the provisions of this Act -
- (a) without reasonable excuse, the proof of which shall be upon him, refuses or neglects or fails to comply with any instructions given to him by the Superintendent of Census or any Assistant Superintendent of Census; or
 - (b) wilfully asks of any person any offensive or improper question; or
 - (c) knowingly makes any false return; or

- (d) without due authority destroys, does away with, secretes, defaces, injures or alters any returns or other document relating to the census; or
- (e) asks, receives or takes from any person any payment or reward other than his lawful remuneration; or
- (f) except in the course of his duty wilfully discloses any information which has come to his knowledge,

shall be guilty of an offence against this Act, and shall for each such offence be liable on conviction before a court of summary jurisdiction to a fine not exceeding one hundred and twenty dollars.

10. No prosecution shall be instituted under this Act without the written consent of the Attorney-General.
11. Where a census has been taken in pursuance of the provisions of this Act, the Superintendent of Census shall, in accordance with directions given to him by the Member, prepare and submit to the Governor a report or reports on the census with the particulars and statistics obtained by the census arranged and tabulated, and with abstracts made from such particulars and statistics.
12. (1) For the avoidance of doubt it is hereby declared that the Secretary to Executive Council may direct the Superintendent of Census or any other census officer of any census to abstract from the forms or other documents used in any census the names, addresses and ages (but no other particulars) of persons therein mentioned, for the purposes of subsection (2).

(2) An abstract prepared pursuant to subsection (1) may be used in the course of duty by any public officer authorised by the Secretary to Executive Council in that behalf for such purposes in the interests of the peace, order and good government of these Islands as the Secretary to Executive Council may authorise.

(3) No abstract prepared pursuant to subsection (1) may be copied by any such authorised officer or be made available to the public.

(4) The Secretary to Executive Council shall retain custody of any abstract prepared pursuant to subsection (1) at all times when it is not in use by an authorised officer.

(5) In this section "census" includes any past census.

THE CENSUS REGULATIONS 1977

B.R. 63/77.

Authority s.6 of
No. 19 of 1950.

(Operative Date 23rd December, 1977)

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Census Regulations 1977.

2. In these Regulations -

"the Census" means the census directed, by the Census Order published on the 23rd September, 1977, to be taken on the 27th November, 1977;

"census night" means the night between the 26th and 27th November, 1977;

"hotel" includes any hotel, boarding house, guest house or lodging house;

"household" and "premises" includes ship or boat ordinarily moored or anchored in Bermudian waters on which any person stays or intends to stay on census night;

"institution" includes a hospital, nursing home, home for aged, sick or destitute, hostel or residential club, boarding school or prison or other place of detention.

3. The following particulars shall be given by any person so required by these Regulations to a census officer if requested by him and he may require the particulars to be given orally or in writing -

- (i) his surname and given names;
- (ii) his permanent address;
- (iii) his usual place of residence if different from his permanent address;
- (iv) where he spent or proposes to spend census night;
- (v) his sex;
- (vi) the date of his birth;
- (vii) the country of his birth;
- (viii) whether he is a British subject;
- (ix) whether he has Bermudian status;
- (x) the length of time he will have been resident in Bermuda on census night;
- (xi) whether he is a registered elector.

4. (1) Every person of the age of sixteen years or over in or proposing to be Bermuda on census night, other than guests in hotels who have not Bermudian status or are not ordinarily resident in Bermuda, shall give the particulars set out in regulation 3 if so requested.
 - (2) The heads of households and persons in charge of hotels and institutions shall give a census officer on request a list of persons ordinarily resident in their households, hotels or institutions, as the case may be, and a list of persons expected to be present in the household, hotels, or institutions on census night.
 - (3) Notwithstanding paragraph (1) a census officer may require any person to give all or any of the particulars mentioned in regulation 3 if he is of the opinion that the giving of such particulars will aid the compilation of the census.
5. A census officer, while acting in the discharge of his duties, may at any reasonable time enter any premises.
 6. Every census officer prior to taking any action under these Regulations shall make the following declaration before a justice of the peace -

"I solemnly and sincerely declare that I will faithfully and honestly fulfil my duties as a census officer and that I will not without lawful authority disclose or make known any information which comes to my knowledge while acting as a census officer."

THE CENSUS REGULATIONS 1980

Made by the Minister of Finance under the Census Act 1950.

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Census Regulations 1980 and shall be read as one with the Census Act 1950.

2. In these Regulations -

"the Census" means the census directed, by the Census Order published on the 8th February, 1980, to be taken on the 12th May, 1980;

"census night" means the night between the 12th and 13th May, 1980;

"hotel" includes any hotel, boarding house, guest house or lodging house or ship not ordinarily moored or anchored in Bermuda;

"household" and "premises" includes ship or boat ordinarily moored or anchored in Bermudian waters on which any person stays or intends to stay on census night;

"institution" includes a hospital, nursing home, home for aged, sick or destitute, hostel or residential club, boarding school or prison or other place of detention.

3. (1) The following particulars shall be given to a census officer by any person so required by these Regulations if so requested by the officer and he may require the particulars to be given or in writing -

- (i) Surname and given names.
- (ii) Relationship to head of household.
- (iii) Sex.
- (iv) Age in completed years.
- (v) Marital status.
- (vi) Usual residence.
- (vii) Birth place (If born in Bermuda the parish of birth; if born outside Bermuda the country of birth).
- (viii) Race.
- (ix) Religion including denomination.
- (x) Number of years lived in parish of residence.
- (xi) Last parish of residence.

- (xii) The number of parishes resided in.
- (xiii) The number of continuous years lived in Bermuda since last arrived if born outside Bermuda (temporary absence to be ignored).
- (xiv) If at school, type of school and whether full or part time.
- (xv) (a) Types of school attended in the past.
(b) Total number of years at school.
(c) Examinations passed or degrees and diplomas awarded.
- (xvi) Profession or vocation for which trained or being trained. How trained or how being trained and how long was the training or how long is the training expected to be.
- (xvii) Whether working or seeking work during the major part of the past year.
- (xviii) Whether employed by another person or self employed during the past week.
- (xix) Months worked during the past year (paid holidays and sick leave are counted as work).
- (xx) Nature of employment or occupation during past week.
- (xxi) Nature of industry or business in which employed during past week.
- (xxii) Economic situation during past week.
- (xxiii) Hours worked in past week at each main or subsidiary occupation including overtime.

Questions to be answered by women only

- (xxiv) How many children ever had.
- (xxv) Age at birth of first child.
- (xxvi) Age at birth of last child.
- (xxvii) Number of children born in past year and number of still born children in same period.
- (xxviii) Status of marital union if not lawfully married, (women over the age of forty-five should give that status as it was when they were forty-five).
- (xxix) How long has the status mentioned above lasted or did it last.

Questions to be answered by everybody

- (xxx) Where is it expected that census night will be spent.

(2) In answering the above questions regard shall be had to the following meanings and explanations -

"past week" and "past year" means the week or year immediately preceding census day;

Question (ii)

"the head of a household" means the owner if living on the premises and in every other case the person living on the premises responsible for the rent and outgoings or the person whom the owner considers responsible for the premises;

Question (xiv)

"school" includes primary and secondary schools and any college or other institution of further education;

Question (xxi)

"nature of industry" means the industry in which the work is carried out e.g. a carpenter working in a hotel should answer "hotel", a clerk working in a contracting firm should answer "contracting";

Question (xxii)

"economic situation" - A person's economic situation is whether he was working, was not working, was seeking first employment, was engaged in household duties, was a student, was on holiday, was sick or was retired;

Questions (xxiv) to (xxvii)

"children" means live-born children;

Question (xxx)

"a marital union if the partners are not lawfully married should be described as "common law" if it is desired to be a permanent relationship or was such a relationship or as "social" if it has not been decided whether it should be a permanent relationship.

4. (1) Every person of the age of sixteen years or over in or proposing to be in Bermuda on census night, other than guests in hotels who have not Bermudian status or are not ordinarily resident in Bermuda, shall give the particulars set out in regulation 3 if so requested during the period from April 10th to May 26th, 1980.
 - (2) The heads of households and persons in charge of hotels and institutions shall give a census officer on request a list of persons ordinarily resident in their households, hotels or institutions, or on board their vessels, as the case may be, and a list of persons expected to be present in the household, hotels, or institutions on census night.
 - (3) Notwithstanding paragraph (1) a census officer may require any person to give all or any of the particulars mentioned in regulations 3 if he is of the opinion that the giving of such particulars will aid the compilation of the census.
5. A census officer may require the head of a household as defined in regulations 3(2) to give the following additional particulars of any member of his household living outside Bermuda -

- (i) Whether when he was resident in Bermuda he was ordinarily resident in the household.
- (ii) The country in which he is residing.
- (iii) Whether he has taken out citizenship or like status in such country.
- (iv) His sex.
- (v) His age in completed years.
- (vi) When he is expected to return to reside in Bermuda.
- (vii) The reason he is residing abroad e.g. study, work, marriage.
- (viii) If a student -

- (a) the course of study being undertaken; and

- (b) the expected date of completion of course of study.

6. (1) A census officer may require any person in charge of any premises occupied as a dwelling to give the following additional particulars -

- (i) Type of premises for which he is in charge.
- (ii) Type tenure.
- (iii) Method of water supply.
- (iv) Toilet facilities.
- (v) Year when dwelling built.
- (vi) Material of outer walls.
- (vii) Number of rooms.
- (viii) Period of rental payment, if any, and amount of rent paid.

- (2) For the purpose of paragraph (1) the person in charge of premises shall have the meaning of the head of household in regulation 3(2).

7. The Superintendent of Census shall make such arrangements as are appropriate with the commanding officers or other persons in charge of -

- (a) persons resident in the United States bases;

- (b) persons on board vessels of Her Majesty or of the United States of America; and

- (c) members of the armed forces of Her Majesty or of the United States of America or any civilian employed in such forces on duty in Bermuda and their families,

to obtain such particulars of such persons as he may consider necessary for the purpose of the census.

8. A census officer, while acting in the discharge of his duties, may at any reasonable time enter any premises.
9. Every census officer prior to taking any action under these Regulations shall make the following declaration before a justice of the peace -

"I solemnly and sincerely declare that I will faithfully and honestly fulfill my duties as a census officer and that I will not without lawful authority disclose or make known any information which comes to my knowledge while acting as a census officer."

APPENDIX VI

CENSUS DEFINITION OF BERMUDA
STATUS AND OF BRITISH NATIONALITY

(The following notes were written for the guidance of Census Officers and are not a detailed exposition of the law.)

BERMUDA STATUS

No person can have Bermuda Status unless he or she is a British subject.

If a person was alive on the 1st July, 1956, then he or she can claim Bermuda Status if he or she had been -

1. (a) born in Bermuda or if born outside of Bermuda his or her parents were ordinarily resident at the date of birth in Bermuda (1937 - (1) (a)); or
- (b) had been continuously resident in the Island on the date for nine years (1937 - 5(1) (b) as amended); or
- (c) had been naturalised as a British subject by the Governor (1937 - 5(1) (c)); or
- (d) the child, stepchild or adopted child of one of the above under sixteen years of age (1937 - 5(1) (e)).

NOTE: These provisions did not apply to expatriate civil servants or to diplomats. (As read with 1956 - 17)

2. After the 1st July, 1956, if a person had not already acquired Bermudian Status under 1 above, it becomes necessary to have one of the following qualifications:

A. A woman if -

- (a) she is married to a man with Bermudian Status and is not living apart from him by reason of a court decree; or (1956 - 16(2))
- (b) she is the widow of a man with Bermudian Status and at his death was not living apart from him as a result of a court decree (1956 - 16(3)).

B. Any person who has a certificate granting him or her Bermudian Status.

- C. Any person other than A or B after the 1st July, 1956 if one of his parents has Bermudian Status and both of his parents at the time of his birth were permanently living in Bermuda. If the child is illegitimate the mother must have Bermudian Status and permanently living in Bermuda.
- D. A legitimate child, stepchild or adopted child under twenty-one years of age of a person who has Bermudian Status.

The above conditions apply even if the child is born outside Bermuda. (1956 - 16(4))

British Subjects are:

Citizens of the United Kingdom and colonies, or of Canada, Australia, New Zealand, India, Pakistan, Southern Rhodesia, Ceylon, Ghana, Malaysia, the Republic of Cyprus, Nigeria, Sierra Leone, Tanzania, Jamaica, Trinidad and Tobago, Uganda, Kenya, Malawi, Zambia, Malta, the Gambia, Guyana, Botswana, Lesotho, Singapore, Barbados, Mauritius, Swaziland, Tonga, Fiji and the Bahamas.

A citizen of the United Kingdom and colonies:

1. A person born within the United Kingdom and Colonies (other than a foreign diplomat) or
2. His father was a citizen of the United Kingdom and Colonies or
3. A naturalised citizen of the United Kingdom and Colonies.

NOTE: It is possible that a person can claim to be a British subject if he has no citizenship, is a citizen of the Republic of Ireland or is a British protected person. In such cases, officers must use their discretion whether to accept them for the purpose of the census as British subjects.
