Introduction:

The purpose of this report is to compile and quantify available data of government funding sources for long term care services and supports to assist the Ministry of Health in policy development to improve the financial sustainability and accessibility of Bermuda's long term care system. Long-Term Care Services and Supports (LTSS) include residential long-term care (care homes and in home care) as well as individual services and supports provided to seniors and persons with disabilities.

The most up to date and available data was collected for this report. Due to various Departments' data collection processes the data time periods differ. This report will be updated over time as more data becomes available and is collected.

This report is a deliverable of the 2017 Long Term Care Action Plan and was submitted to the Steering Committee in December 2017.

War Veterans - 2015-2016

The War Veterans fund provides support for veterans and spouses of deceased veterans. War Vets pays the FutureCare premium for all who are eligible. War Vets also pays for a number of services not provided by FutureCare or for benefits which are limited under FutureCare.

To date, the only funding that we have been able to separate for War Vets is for payment for residential care – Care Homes for 19 persons and Home Care for 22 persons.
